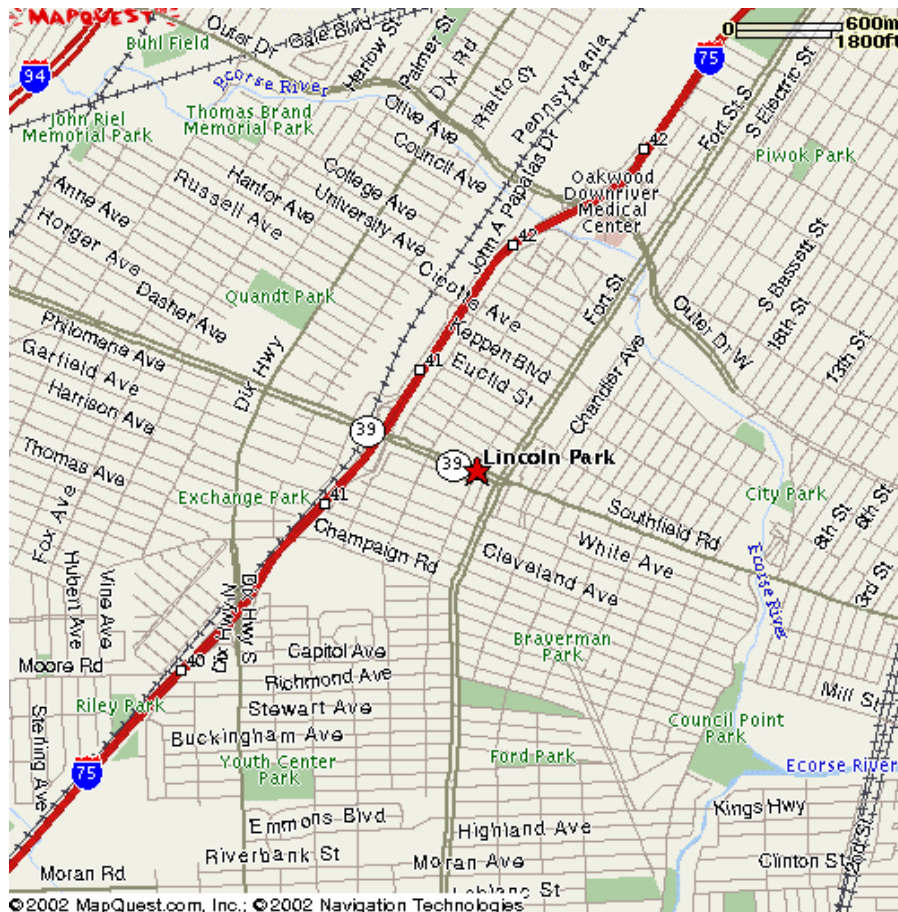

WELCOME to our Lincoln Park Michigan. The City of Lincoln Park is a residential community and suburb of the ever growing city of Detroit. The area was laid out in 1906 and incorporated as a village in 1921. Then in 1925 it became incorporated as a city.

Lincoln Park is approximately 5.93 sq. miles and is intersected by I-75, Fort Street, and Southfield Rd. I-94 and the Detroit River is about 1 mile from the city. Lincoln Park is about 15 minutes to downtown Detroit.

Lincoln Park has become a mature, stable community where citizens enjoy a moderate tax base, excellent school systems, nice parks and recreational facilities, a community renewal program, a well-regulated city government, and its own outstanding museum of local history.
