LETTER FROM THE MAYOR



Hello, Neighbor!

I hope that your summer was great and your fall will be even better. We have had an exciting year and I look forward to many new challenges and opportunities in the coming months.

We are again wrapping up a construction season that has seen your city government make an impressive investment in our community's infrastructure. We have used a variety of revenue sources to make outstanding progress in this area. Street sectioning projects that have been or soon will be completed include areas of Cicotte, Howard, Council, LeBlanc, and Ford (approx. \$300,000). Additional street sections will also be completed between Southfield and Outer Drive from Dix to the western city limits (approx. \$600,000). The 2004 Street Improvement project including Champaign from Dix to the western city limits, as well as sections of Riopelle, Markese and Cicotte will also soon be completed (approx. \$1.332 million). Southfield from Lafayette to Porter will also be reconstructed in cooperation with the MDOT. Various sections of sewer throughout Lincoln Park will also be replaced or sliplined (approx. \$700,000). These projects will result in a total investment in our infrastructure of over \$3 million.

We have successfully changed and improved the way your city government functions by hiring Steve Duchane as City Manager in April 2004. This exciting development has already paid huge dividends by greatly increasing the accountability and efficiency of city government. Mayor and Council are also working on an exciting plan to reinvent city government and better align our revenues and expenditures to allow us to continue and improve the services we provide. We know that is why your city government exists and we will continue to sharpen our focus on giving you the services you deserve and expect.

We have also greatly improved our web site. We have added tax and assessment information on all property located in Lincoln Park to better serve our citizens as well as the business community that needs ready access to this information. We have provided online forms for your convenience as well as the ability to pay your taxes by telephone or online. We continue to add current information including a new calendar of city events so that you can be better informed about your community. We have also made accessing our web site easier by allowing access to the site at the following address: www.citylp.com

We continue to work hard at making the one and ONLY official web site of Lincoln Park City government the most convenient AND useful site for information on our community.

Please enjoy fall in Lincoln Park. I encourage you to take part in some of the fantastic recreational opportunities outlined in this issue of our Happenings. As usual, the Parks & Recreation Department has put together great programs for all of us here in Lincoln Park. We would love to see you!

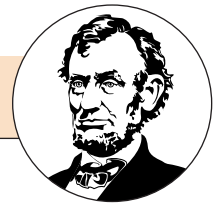

Compost collection runs from April 1st to November 26. Christmas trees will be collected for 2 weeks following the Holiday.

The Lincoln Park City Hall has moved... virtually! Visitors can access the many business features and services of the official City government web site at its new address www.citylp.com

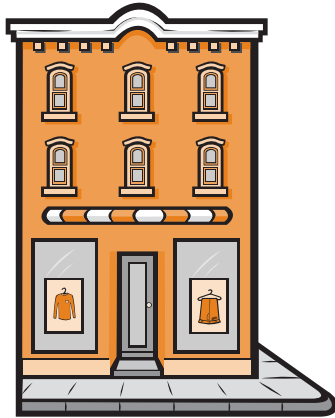
The City is also pleased to announce a new service, **Property Tax and Assessing Information, ON-LINE.**

MESSAGE FROM THE CLERKS OFFICE PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENTS NOVEMBER 2, 2004 GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT

Registration Deadline: Monday, October 4, 2004

(1) The purpose of the proposed Charter Amendment:



"It is proposed that the Charter of the City of Lincoln Park and specifically Section 1 of Chapter III of the City Charter be amended to **abolish the elected position of City Treasurer.**"

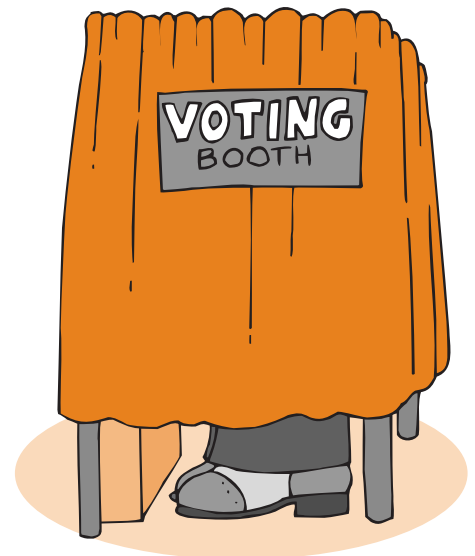
Do you favor amending Chapter III, Section 1 of the Charter of the City of Lincoln Park to provide that the elected officers of the City shall be Mayor, one City Clerk, and six Council Members, all of whom shall be elected in the City at large?

(It is the intent of the Mayor and Council to abolish the part-time elected Treasurer, allowing for the appointment of one full-time Treasurer/Assessor position.)

(2) The purpose of the proposed Charter Amendment:

"It is proposed that the Charter of the City of Lincoln Park and specifically Sections 19 and 20 of Chapter VI be amended to provide that the City may sell upon Resolutions of the City Council and real property provided that the value does not exceed **one dollar per capita.**"

Do you favor amending Chapter VI, Section 19 and 20 of the Charter of the City Lincoln Park to provide that the City shall have power upon proper Resolutions of the Council, to dispose of its real property by sale, lease or trade on terms deemed appropriate provided that the value of any real property to be sold does not exceed **one dollar per capita?**



(It is the intent of the Mayor and Council to allow for the sale of real property at fair market value.)

FREE INCOME TAX SERVICE

AARP trained volunteers provide free income tax service for middle to low-income people every Wednesday from January 26 to April 13 at the Bandshell. Volunteers are available to answer questions and prepare Federal, State and City of Detroit Tax forms between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. The number of clients that can sign-in each Wednesday depends on the number of volunteer available. (In February, due to the heavy volume, some client's names will be carried over to the next Wednesday; sign-in sheet.)

All clients should bring:

- A copy of the previous year's tax forms
- All documents of income (W-2's, 1099's, ect.)
- Basis of stock, if any sold
- Any possible deductions, if itemizing
- Social security cards for all family members

State of Michigan Homestead Credits are based on a percentage of household income versus the amount of property tax billed for 2004 or amount of rent paid. Bring the 2004 tax bills or rent receipts and any medical insurance premiums paid, including medical premiums on car insurance. Heating credits are possible for low-income people even if heat is included in rent. A limited number of returns can be filed electronically by computer to the IRS and State; inquire when you sign-in.

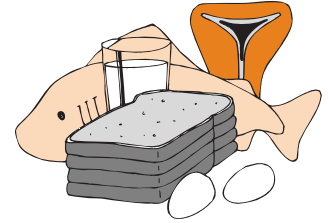

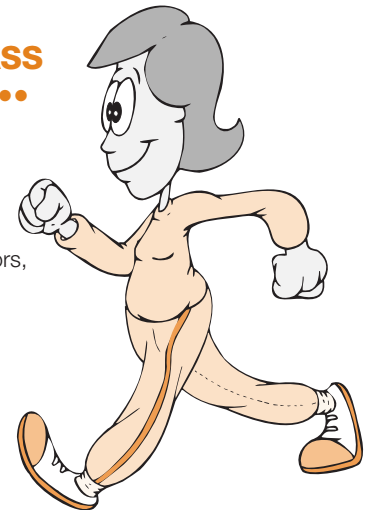

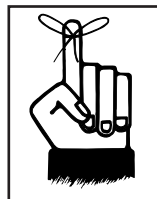
